


From the President's Office

Brown Bag Discussions

The Learning Signature Task Force will be organizing several Brown Bag Discussions throughout the year. Brown Bag Discussions are designed to be loosely structured conversations for the NMSU-A campus community—faculty, staff, administrators—about a wide variety of topics.

Each discussion will be led by a colleague or colleagues, but the content of the conversation will be largely determined by the participants and will include open time for questions and answers. Evaluation is scheduled for February 13-14, 2017, and will include an emphasis on comparative data on distance persistence, retention and completion and an embedded interim report on implementing Phase 1 of quality matters. In preparation for this visit, our HLC Liaison (Dr. Linnea Stenson) will visit NMSU-A on Friday, January 26, 2016.

The “Self-Study” has been replaced with an online Assurance Argument, which is basically a self-study with succinct documentation and evidence to address compliance and challenges associated with the Criteria for Accreditation. Faculty and staff may be asked to contribute information and/or evidence in support of the Assurance Argument. If you have any topics or concerns you think are pertinent to the Criteria for Accreditation, please email them ghillis@namsu.edu. The Assurance Argument is scheduled to be completed in early Fall 2016.



Scholarship News for Students: The All-USA Community College Academic Team Scholarship and the Coca-Cola and All-State Academic Team Scholarships are open to all NMSU-A students. Candidates are usually second-year students with at least a 3.5 GPA and are engaged in campus and community service activities and leadership.

If a student wants to apply, he should sign in as a Phi Theta Kappa (PTK) International Honor Society member or register online at <https://www.ptk.org/Scholarships.aspx> and then complete the eligibility quiz. If he is eligible for the scholarship, then he will complete the extensive application form. The NMSU-A *internal deadline is November 9, 2015*. The All-USA Scholarship Selection Committee here on campus will choose the top two candidates and work with them to produce the best applications for final submission in early December.

In 2011 and 2012, our students received Gold and Silver Scholarship Awards as part of the Coca-Cola Academic Team and All-New Mexico Community College All-Academic Team. Text Your Students/Organization Without Giving Out Your Phone Number:

Remind.com is a resource for educators. It allows you to set up a FREE account. Your students can then send a text message to the number 81010 with a course-specific code in the body of the message to sign up for text alerts. You can text individual students or the entire class without having to give out your phone number or gather their numbers. **You can register multiple courses, and you'll receive a unique course code** for students to use in the body of the text when registering.

The Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act: If you are studying for a job field that New Mexico has a strong demand for, then you may want to learn more about the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA). Signed into federal law in 2014, WIOA is about helping people find jobs, including providing funds to assist eligible students pursuing occupations that are in demand. WIOA funding is not guaranteed, nor automatic, but students seeking training in jobs that New Mexico needs are highly encouraged to apply.

For example, registered nurse (RN) is one example of a high demand field in New Mexico. Students accepted into the Bachelors of Science in Nursing (BSN) program leading to an RN degree should contact their local WIOA coordinator for more information.

NMSU-Alamogordo phlebotomy students: The phlebotomy students **supported the Alamo Senior Center's Annual Health Fair on Thursday, September 24th**. The students, overseen by their instructors, provided blood pressure checks and blood sugar testing to the fair's visitors.

The phlebotomy class is one of several sponsored by a Department of Labor grant called SUN PATH designed to help residents quickly enter healthcare fields. Students can qualify as phlebotomists, learning to draw blood samples for clinical laboratory testing, in as little as one semester.
