NMSU-A Spotlight: Renewable Energy

Instructor, Clay Blevins

Clay Blevins is NMSU-A's longest-standing Renewable Energy Instructor. He began working at NMSU-A as a math tutor and instructor in 1999. Since then, he has been working with the NMSU-A Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math (STEM) Project, and has developed most of the important curricular elements of the campus renewable energy program, including the Renewable Energy Systems Technology Associate of Applied Science Degree and two embedded certificates; the Certificate in Photo Voltaic Entry Level Grid-Tie and the Certificate in Advanced Photo Voltaic Installation.

In addition to the curricular development, Mr. Blevins has donated his own time and effort to select and oversee the purchase, set-up, and maintenance of more than 5.5 million dollars of state-of-the-art renewable energy instructional and laboratory equipment and supplies for the campus' STEM and Title V grants. These purchases include cutting edge technology such as:

- ❖ wind, solar, and electronic trainers
- ❖ a transportable home energy efficiency and auditing laboratory
- ❖ both photovoltaic and solar thermal troubleshooting trainers for solar water heating

Mr. Blevins has also participated in the design and construction of:

- ❖ a roof-on-wheels for on-the-ground rooftop solar system installation practice
- ❖ a full-sized learning canopy upon which students practice safe installation at normal roof height

Mr. Blevins has managed to make NMSU-A the only university renewable energy program that actually ties into the PNM grid. To do so, he negotiated work and materials with them, saving the campus an additional \$10,000 in purchasing this service.

He is currently overseeing the design and construction of a 60 foot wind turbine tower for the program. The tower will fold down to a concrete pad, facilitating access for all NMSU-A Renewable Energy students. Again, Mr. Blevins has managed to negotiate with PNM's assistance in the installation at no cost to the campus.

Aside from his numerous accomplishments in the design, development, and setup of the Renewable Energy Laboratory at New Mexico State University Alamogordo, Mr. Blevins enthusiastically presents at events and meetings throughout the region, promoting renewable energy, recruiting for the program, and sharing his love of technical engineering endeavors. He also works as a volunteer and networks with other specialists in renewable energies throughout the region.

On Wednesday, June 29th, current and former members of the Online Quality Assurance Team met for the first day of a working retreat. With the upcoming visit by the Higher Learning Commission (HLC), the topic of the day was the accomplishments and improvements we've made to our online course offerings and online infrastructure over the course of the last three years. Noteworthy accomplishments include the creation of online delivery standards, comprehensive training on both online design and delivery principles, creating a required template and a recommended "shell" for designing online courses, providing online support services for our online students, mentoring faculty, and conducting 178 Quality Matters reviews over the three-year period, of which 146 were external reviews. A course that meets the Quality Matters standards in an external review receives national recognition as a quality online course.

In the last three years, we've gone from being "dinged" by HLC to receiving the prestigious "Outstanding Impact by an Organization" award from Quality Matters at its 6th Annual Conference. We never would have gotten there without the hard work of our faculty and staff, with special thanks to the members of the Quality Assurance Team: Kim Lopez-Gallagher, Christine Trapp, Kathy Roark-Diehl, Gary Bond, Claire Forsmann, Sherrell Wheeler, Karen May, John Adams, and Rob Klinger.

Aggie Cupboard Alamogordo Team Makes and Serves Community Meal Feeding Over 100 People

On Monday, June 20th, a handful of NMSU Alamogordo faculty, staff, and retirees put a meal together for one of our local Community Meals.

Community Meals are served at different locations around the city nearly every evening to help support low-income families, the homeless, and the elderly in our community.

The Aggie Cupboard Alamogordo Team worked to make enough lasagna, salad, and dessert to feed over 100 people! One challenge is to determine a menu that will work within the constraints of a particular kitchen (and the team's culinary skills). Then the team does the math to make the recipe work to feed 100 to 150 people. It seems simple on one hand, but this is no exact science. The team planned and gathered the groceries with the help of Janett Quick and Donnetta Compos of the Hunger Coalition, who work with the city's food recovery program. Janett and Donnetta were able to get 15 pounds of ground turkey, eggs, cottage cheese, some mozzarella cheese, garlic bread, and desserts from area grocery stores and the Holloman Commissary.

The NMSU Alamogordo community supported the team with salad fixings. Thanks to all of you who donated produce on Monday. The salad was every bit as popular as the lasagna!
